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Teacher Notes

Use this handy booklet to play some rhyming-word games with your students. There are lots of ways to use this document in a fun, engaging way in the primary classroom. More about that in the *Classroom Activities Guide*.

First, a disclaimer! 😊 This document is aimed at helping primary school teachers to help their students learn to read and spell high-frequency words and decode/pronounce similar-looking common words which may, or may not rhyme. Therefore the rhyming words you find tabulated are NOT an exhaustive list of all rhyming words in English. Words which appear to us to be particularly irrelevant to a primary school student's vocabulary have been purposefully omitted. For example, *soon* – *moon* *noon* *cartoon* are in, but not *pontoon* or *boon*. There may be debate about accent/pronunciation too. Some people say *sure* like *shore*, *door* or *more*. Others may say it more like *cure* or *endure*, *newer*...

If you think it's worth pointing out pronunciation differences amongst native English speakers, that's up to you! We think that with some words at least, such as *again*, it's very worthwhile to note the different pronunciations (*again/rain*, *again/pen*) because you can use these cases to help consolidate students' awareness of what constitutes long and short vowel-sounds. It's also a good opportunity to have a good laugh with your students at the chaos that is English spelling/pronunciation and let them know that it's okay to feel frustrated when learning to read and write in English.

Finally, when using this document as a teaching aid, it's important to spend a little bit of time clarifying what, exactly, constitute rhyming words. Quite often, especially in an ESL context, younger students don't fully understand this concept. For example, many students will be able to recognize that *water* and *daughter* are rhyming words, but only when they hear them. Their assumption upon looking at those two words on paper will be that they don't rhyme. Likewise, students are prone to focusing solely on spelling and presume that words which contain the last two or three same letters must be rhyming words. Therefore, they will presume on sight that *water* and *later* must be rhyming words too, because they share exactly the same letters except the first. This is the whole point of making this document and using it as a classroom aid. We want students to understand that there are a lot of common anomalies with sound-spelling and they need to learn the common ones.

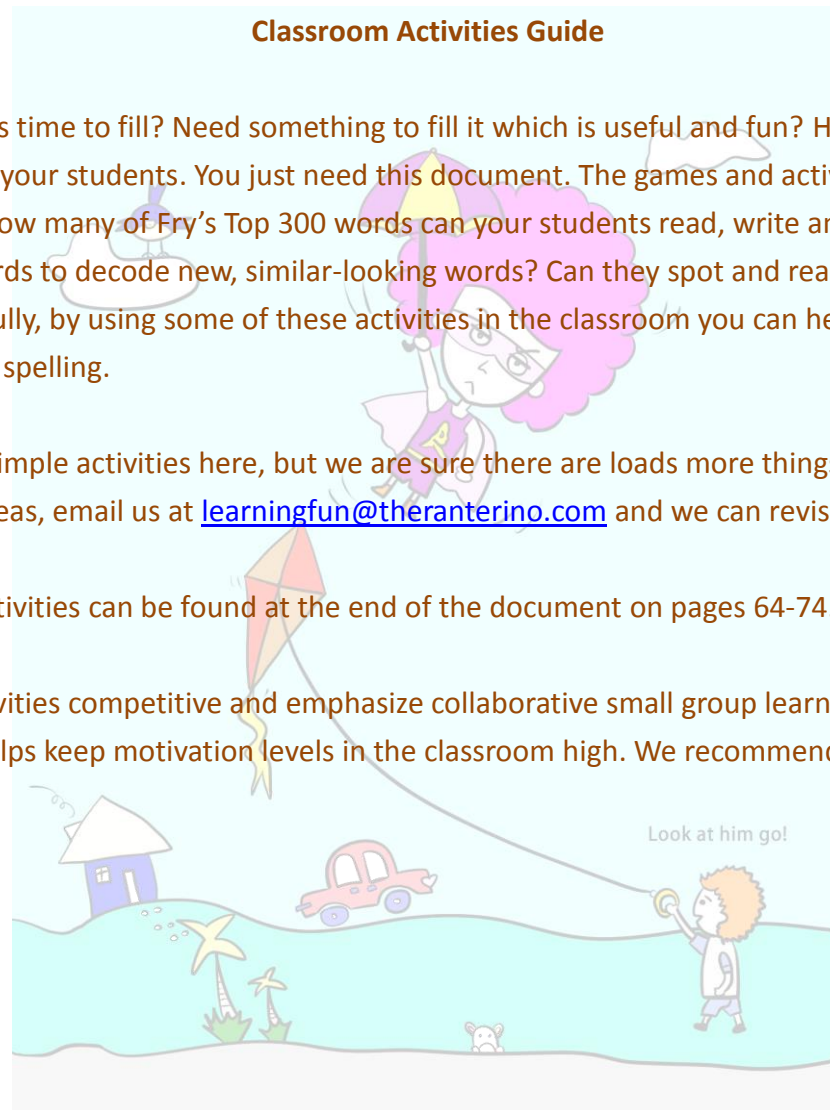

Can they spot and read correctly common anomalies? These activities will help you find out! Hopefully, by using some of these activities in the classroom you can help your students develop a greater awareness of basic English sounds and spelling.

Activity 1: Minimal Pairs +1

1. Choose two words from the list which have the same spelling pattern but different pronunciation. For example; **though** **cough**
2. Ask students how to pronounce **though**
3. Ask students how to pronounce **cough**
4. Show worksheet (Template 1, see page 65) and add in **though** to the first column, **cough** to the second column
5. Ask students in pairs or small groups to race to add as many words into **though** and **cough** columns. The words in each column should rhyme!
6. Focus students on the third empty column and add the word **rough**. Explain why it is there: It has the same spelling pattern as **though/cough**, but it is pronounced differently. Ask students to try and think of any words that rhyme with **rough**. Remind students that some rhyming words they think of may have different spelling patterns. Tell them not to worry about the spelling patterns. Tell them to focus on the pronunciation
7. Repeat activity with another 3 words from the list

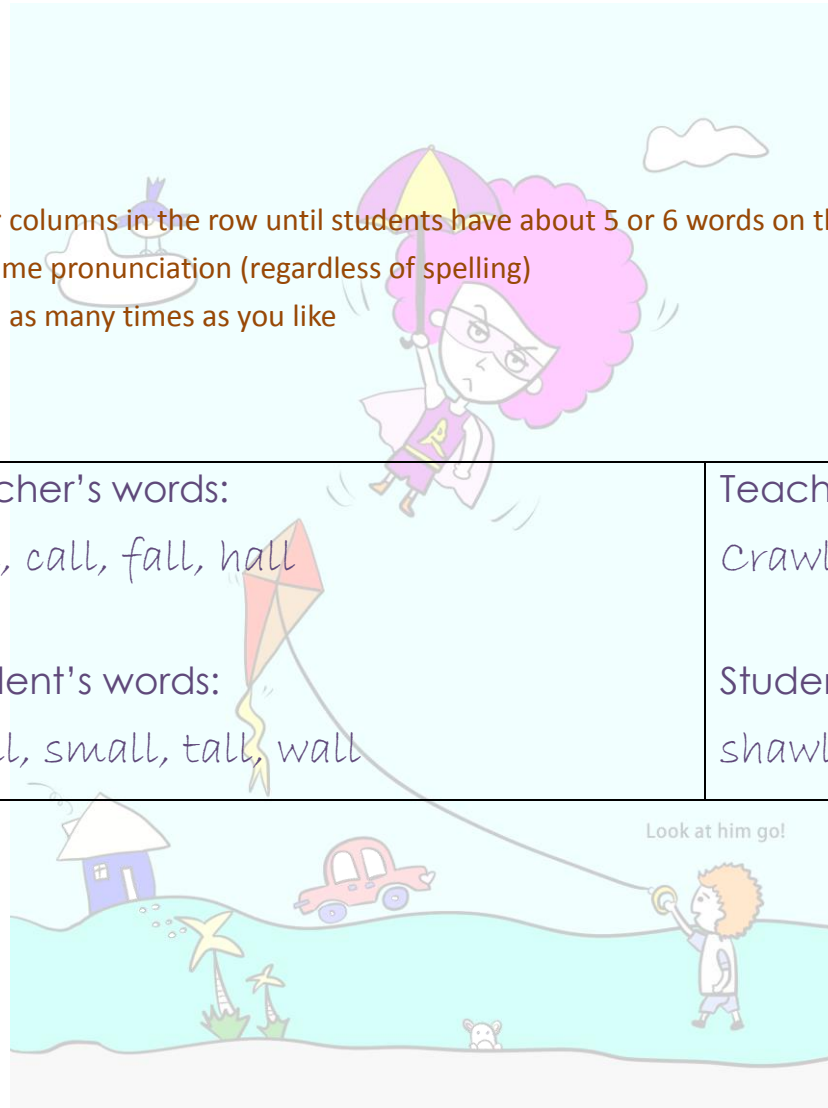

Activity 2: Random Spelling Bee

1. Choose a word from the Fry lists
2. Ask students to write it down
3. Repeat with words from the other columns in the row until students have about 5 or 6 words on their worksheet (Template 2)
4. Ask students to add words with same pronunciation (regardless of spelling)
5. Repeat activity with another word as many times as you like

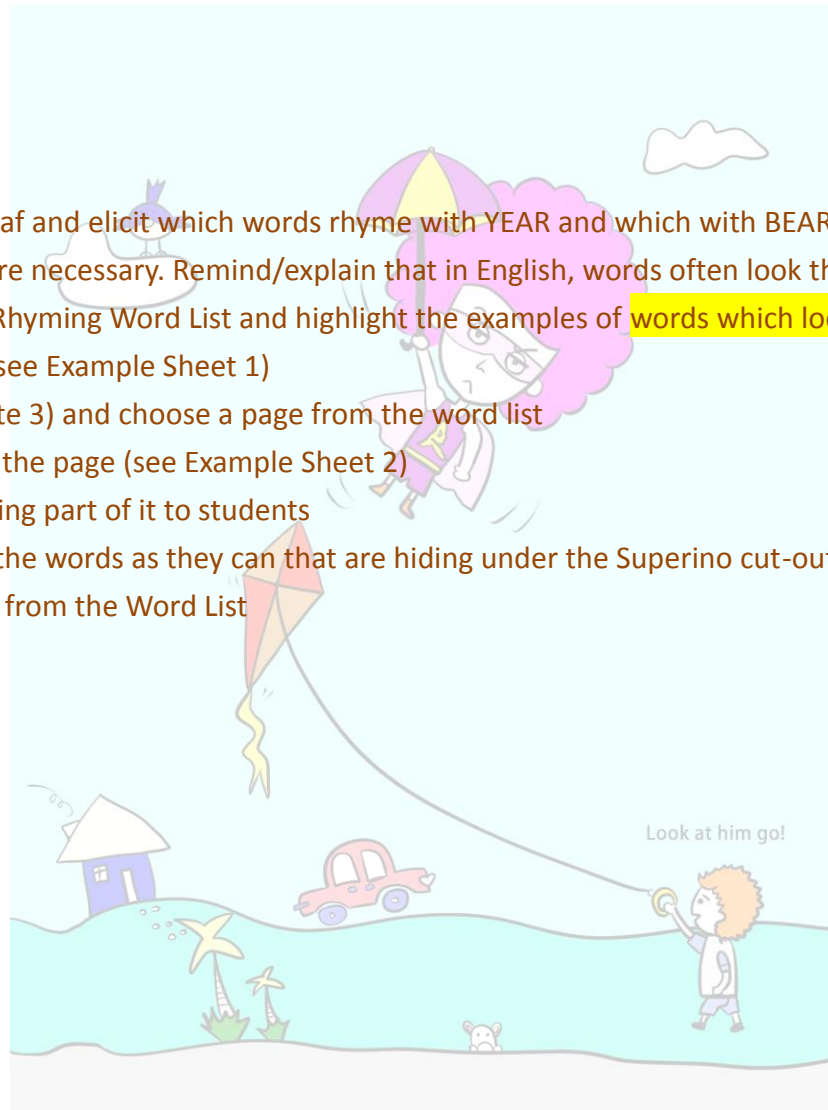

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Activity 3: How many rhyming words?

*You need a projector for this!

1. Show students the *-ear* list overleaf and elicit which words rhyme with YEAR and which with BEAR. Draw arrows off each word, pointing at either YEAR or BEAR, or both where necessary. Remind/explain that in English, words often look the same but do not always rhyme
2. Choose any page from the Super Rhyming Word List and highlight the examples of words which look the same and rhyme and words that look the same but do not rhyme (see Example Sheet 1)
3. Use the cut-out Superino (Template 3) and choose a page from the word list
4. Place the cut-out over any part of the page (see Example Sheet 2)
5. Show the page with cut-out covering part of it to students
6. Ask students to guess as many of the words as they can that are hiding under the Superino cut-out
7. Repeat activity with another page from the Word List

Activity 4: Word list sorting

1. Choose a row of words from the Word List (example – though)
2. Write a list of the words from that row in very random fashion on the board
3. Ask students to look at the words and in pairs or small groups decide which columns they need to put the words. Students add the words to the columns on worksheet (Template 4)
4. Repeat activity with another row from the Word List

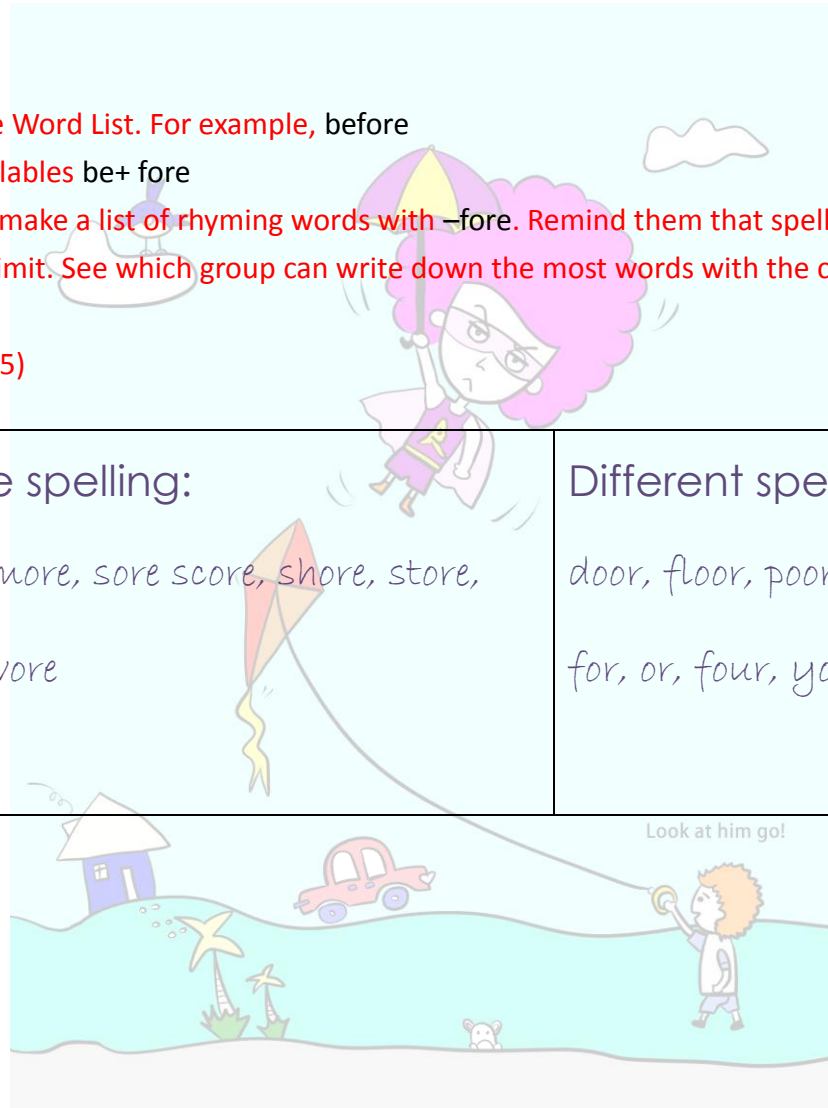

Activity 5: Rhyming Race

1. Give the students a word from the Word List. For example, before
2. Break the word down into its 2 syllables be+ fore
3. Ask students in pairs or groups to make a list of rhyming words with -fore. Remind them that spelling of some rhyming words will be the same, some different. Set a time limit. See which group can write down the most words with the correct spelling

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Activity 6: Peer Testing

1. Put students into small groups
2. Give each group a worksheet (Template 6)
3. Ask students to write a word in the first column. Any word they want!
4. Each group passes their worksheet to the next group (go in a clockwise order so all groups receive another group's worksheet)
5. Each group adds rhyming words with same spelling in column 2. Each group then passes the worksheet in clockwise direction to next group
6. Group adds words to column three – rhyming word with different spelling
7. Repeat with fourth column – false rhyming words
8. Repeat with fifth column – same spelling, different sound
9. With all worksheets now completed Teacher can lead a random spelling bee using words from worksheets. Repeat whole activity

Activity 7: Silly Sentences

1. Choose a fry words row from Word List. Example: Show students row below (All)
2. Model the sentence below, emphasizing to students that you are trying to use as many words as possible from the row in one single sentence: *I shall tell all the small people in the hall to crawl and throw a ball at the wall.*

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3. Choose another row from the Word List and ask students in pairs or small groups to come up with a long and silly sentence. The winning group is the group with the longest, silliest sentence
4. Repeat activity with another row

Activity 8: Alphabet Scales Game

1. Write a list on the board and ss guess which one is not the rhyming word
2. Pick a word from the Word List. For example, **when**
3. Break the word up into its constituent parts and highlight the final rhyming sound of the word: **wh + en**
4. On the board, start adding new prefixes to the ending using the alphabet, like this:

Wh + en

Alphabet scales

aen

ben

cen

den

een

fen

5. Ask students to decide which of the new words are real English words, and which words are not
6. Hand out worksheet (Template 8) and ask students to make an alphabet list of words using another random word from the Word List
7. As a whole class read through various students' 26 words and ask the students to decide which ones are real English words
8. Repeat activity with another word

Activity 9: Three Missing Words

1. Model the game first like this - Write on the board the following:

<u>Word</u>	<u>What is it?</u>
PEN	Something you write with
HEN	an animal, like a chicken
TEN	a number

2. Repeat with the following and ask students to guess what the three missing words are (they should be rhyming words, of course!):

<u>Word</u>	<u>What is it?</u>
?	It's round
?	This room has 4
?	Not short

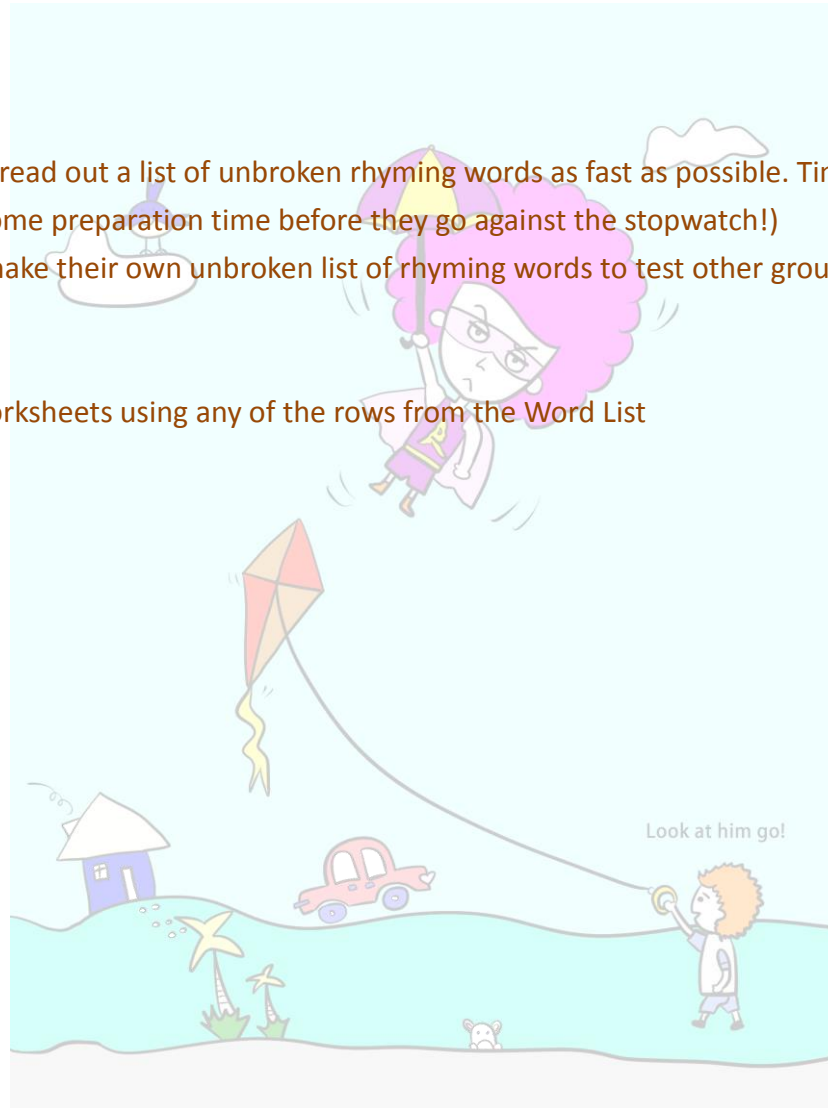
3. Now ask students, using the worksheet (Template 9), to choose 3 rhyming words and write a simple definition for each word in the space provided
4. Students can then move around the classroom reading out their three definitions and asking other students to guess the three words.
(Remind students to keep their worksheets close to their chests so the other students cannot see their three words)




Activity 10: Speed Reading Aloud Race

1. Ss have to individually or in groups read out a list of unbroken rhyming words as fast as possible. Time it with stopwatch to find out who is the fastest. (Be sure to give them some preparation time before they go against the stopwatch!)
2. In pairs or small groups, students make their own unbroken list of rhyming words to test other groups with. See worksheet (Template 10)
